GRASSROOTS PARTICIPATION TARGETS Key milestones by 2026...

- > 120,000 registered players (77,161 in 2021)
- > 100,000 registered male players (68,325 in 2021)
- > 20,000 registered female players (8,836 in 2021)

GRASSROOTS VOLUNTEER AND COACH GROWTH

- > 16,000 registered coaches (10,579 in 2021)
- 12,500 registered volunteers in clubs, leagues and Area Associations (5,000 in 2021)
- > 1,500 registered referees (859 in 2021)
